June Meeting Minutes

EAA 301 Meeting Minutes June 17, 2022

The meeting was called to order at 7:03 pm by Vice President **James Taylor.** Steve was still out of town.

The May Meeting minutes were unanimously approved as published.

Treasurer **Hugh Cook** stated that some funds were paid for our Ray Scholarship candidates recent flying bills, and the chapter remains solvent and in good financial shape. He also reminded the attendees to promote the chapter to help bring in new members, since our current membership numbers have decreased from approximately 150

down to only 97.

Old Business:

Hugh Cook mentioned the discussion at a recent tenant's meeting at KCFO airport, where many of our members and our chapter hangar facilities are based. The airport has received funding and hired a contractor to begin placing new taxiway lights along the entire length of taxiway alpha. They plan to do this in 7 different phases, and the areas of the taxiway being worked on will be closed during that time. This will make getting to and from runway 08/26 and to and from the ramp a challenging task. Remember to check NOTAMs and plan your flights carefully.

Hugh and Blanche also reported that they are also going to begin putting up security gates at all access points to the hangar and tramp areas. So we may no longer have the same "free" access to the facilities as we have enjoyed in years past, and will have to adjust procedures accordingly.

Blanche and Hugh both reported that recent tower closures were due to ATC staffing issues caused by COVID.

James Taylor reminded everyone about the discussion during the previous meeting about a proposed program to gather information from chapter members who would like to help builders and flyers, and to list your areas of expertise or other information about the extent of any assistance that you would be willing to provide.

The desire for chapter flyout was discussed. Randall Eaker reminded everyone that just before COVID hit, the chapter held a vote to determine the location of the first chapter flyout event, and Pueblo Airport was chosen. The members agreed that we should still try to put that together, perhaps for some time later this year. Other possible flyouts for consideration included A monthly fly-in breakfast and Chaparell airport, Silvercliffe, and Butler airport.
