President Walt Jazun called the meeting to order at 7:03 pm. The meeting was held at the Colorado Skies Academy near Centennial Airport. Guests and visitors were welcomed. Hannah Stauffer brought her friend Mia Vaughn to the meeting.

Hannah is an EAA scholarship recipient and Mia is developing an interest in aviation. Welcome Mia!

Projects:

Marcus Cooper continues to make progress on his RV-14. Marcus has all the kits for the project from Van's and is now starting on the forward fuselage.

Chuck Spaur recently hung the engine on his RV-6, with the expert assistance of long-time 301 member Denis Walsh and Mike Manzitto.

Maud Narrol and David Gissen reported the electric propellor on their Rans S-21 has been recalled, and the electric motor will be making the journey to New Zealand. David will make use of the downtime by getting the condition inspection completed.

John Tedder shared that he had found a good resource for aircraft insurance. If you're looking at aircraft insurance options talk with John.

Published minutes from the December chapter meeting were approved without modification.

New Business:

Pat Diamond is wearing many hats for the chapter including overseeing scholarships, safety briefings, and serving no the Chapter 301 board of directors. 
