is about phase 1 testing. In april, the FAA updated AC 90-89C -Amateur-Built Aircraft and Ultralight Flight Testing Handbook. This AC provides suggestions and safetyrelated recommendations primarily to assist amateur-built aircraft and ultralight vehicle builders in developing individualized flight test plans. It also provides guidance for **Experimental Light-Sport Aircraft** (ELSA) flight testing after modifications to the aircraft. It provides recommendations and suggestions you can combine with other sources on test flying, such as the aircraft plan/kit manufacturer's flight testing instructions and other flight testing data. This will help you develop a detailed flight test plan, tailored for your aircraft or ultralight vehicle and resources. The contents of this document do not have the force and effect of law and are not meant to bind the public in any way, and the document is intended only to provide information to the public regarding existing requirements under the law or agency policies.

April Meeting Minutes

President Steve Paschke called the meeting to order at 7:04 pm. The meeting was held at the Colorado Skies Academy near Centennial Airport (KAPA). Minutes of the March meeting were approved without modification.

Treasurer's Report

Old Business

AirVenture was discussed with 14 meeting attendees planning to make the pilgrimage to Wisconsin this Summer. New Business

Russ Grell pointed out some negative publicity in the local press around traffic noise and possible lead pollution at KAPA. The groups pressing this story are supported by a national organization and are generally focused on restricting operations and eventually closing GA airports. After some discussion the general consensus was that as supporters of aviation we need to make our voices heard. The economic benefits of airports like KAPA are well documented and that side of the discussion must be prosecuted with vigor. Aviation enthusiasts are encouraged to reach out to their representatives and remind them of the value aviation brings to our community.

On a brighter note, Russ displayed a copy of the recently released RV Maintenance Handbook by Vic Syracuse. Russ gave the book a strong recommendation. Published early this year, the book is available at pilotshop.com, thebookpatch.com and other online book sellers.

President Steve Paschke met with officials from the Exploration of Flight group at the Wings Over the Rockies at Centennial Airport. Cooperation and Chapter 301 participation in Wings Over the Rockies events is being planned.
