President's Message

The current GA trends and issues seem to

Electric Aviation:

One of the most significant trends in general aviation is the ongoing development and adoption of electric aircraft. Companies like Pipistrel and Bye Aerospace have introduced electric-powered training aircraft, demonstrating the feasibility and potential for electric propulsion in smaller aircraft. The shift towards electric aviation is driven by the desire to reduce emissions, operating costs, and noise levels. The development of more powerful and energy-dense batteries is a key enabler for the growth of electric aviation.

Advanced Avionics and Connectivity:

Urban Air Mobility (UAM):

The concept of urban air mobility, involving the use of small electric vertical takeoff and landing (eVTOL) aircraft for short-distance transportation within urban areas, is gaining traction. Numerous companies are exploring the development of eVTOL vehicles for air taxis and on-demand transportation. While regulatory challenges remain, the potential for reducing congestion and improving transportation efficiency in urban environments is driving interest and investment in this emerging sector.

Sustainability Initiatives:

Environmental concerns are increasingly shaping the general aviation landscape. Sustainable aviation fuels (SAFs) are being explored as an alternative to traditional aviation fuels, aiming to reduce the carbon footprint of general aviation operations. Additionally, manufacturers are focusing on designing more fuel-efficient and environmentally friendly aircraft to align with global efforts to address climate change.

Aviation fuels is probably the most urgent and has the most direct affect on us now. This has come to the for front recently and hopefully, the FAA will finally get moving faster on it.
