But more important, he's a Commercial pilot, SEL, MEI, Instrument, Glider, Tailwheel and an A&P.

October Young Eagles Oct 28 @ Spaceport Our last rally of the year. Of the scheduled nine 2024 rallys at Spaceport, seven are already booked! Two months are still open in case of weather cancellation early in the year. If we get thru to March, there are 3 groups in line to book May & June. FAA is still a possibility for either of those months but no decision until after the first of the year.

For those participating on Oct 28, the three groups are Denver Public Schools, Adams County Public Schools, and a homeschool. We've been flying DPS for many years. Adams County is new, as is the homeschool. The homeschool group are classmates of Shane's children. Shane, if you're not aware, is the Spaceport ATC tower manager.

Last week I received an email from Leslie (FBO manager) and Jeff (airport manager) letting me know that the Adams County Commissioners (the people who control the airport) are very interested in the Young Eagle program and will be visiting during the rally. Of course I made the offer of an Eagle Flight for anyone interested after we finish flying the kids.

I write this on Tuesday, Oct 10. On Thursday I'm off to Richfield, UT for the annular eclipse in my secret disguise as a Civil Air Patrol Aerospace Education Officer and out of touch until the following Tuesday. (Russ, this will make an incredible addition to the Blacksheep AE report!) More than 40,000 people are expected in Richfield, a town of just over 8,000. Over 200 CAP members (mostly Cadets) from 5 surrounding states will be there. NASA has tagged our cadets to conduct experiments during the eclipse. This has gotten HUUUUGE! NPR. NY Times. Univision and many area media will be there. Assuming they can get thru the traffic jam. I considered flying - 4 hrs vs 8 hrs driving and no traffic (or not much) but I can't take the chance of bad weather and can't miss classes on Monday morning. Of course if this turns out similar to the eclipse in 2017, the traffic in the air will be almost as bad as traffic on the roads.
